2025 TORCH BENEFIT CONCERT IS CONFIRMED!

Our musicians will be performing a concert to benefit **Lynnhaven River NOW** at the **Harrison Opera House** on **Saturday November 15th** (time TBD).

This is under the auspices of **TORCH - Thanking Our Resident Community Heroes**. Unlike our project in 2023 (to benefit **For Kids**), hiring and payment this time will be through the **Virginia Symphony** and will be on the VSO scale (not Local #125 gig scale). As before, the **Virginia Arts Festival** is handling most of the publicity and logistical effort with the assistance of the Symphony and the beneficiary organization.



This work is optional. Those participating will be paid over & above any salary they would otherwise receive, added to their end-of-November pay (as will anyone paid per service including subs).

I do not solicit donations to the cause generally BUT for these TORCH projects, voluntary small contributions coming from the musicians (cash or check collected on the day of the event), will make possible a public announcement from the stage that "the performers have all (?) contributed to Lynnhaven River NOW." Such an announcement helps fulfill the third objective of these events:

1. To contribute to a worthy local organization (**T**hanking **O**ur **R**esident **C**ommunity **H**eroes)
2. To provide paid work for our Union Musicians
3. To burnish the reputation of the Musicians' Union

The first objective is achieved with ticket sales and any donations associated with the Benefit Concert. The idea of having our musicians give back to a worthy local organization (not in the performing arts) with our talent was born after COVID 19 with the thought of leveraging gifts to musicians in need, becoming instead a paid gig for them and a contribution from the artists back to the community, thus flipping our usual business model (of asking for money) on its head once a year.

We missed 2024 but resume what should become an annual tradition this fall. (In 2026 we will benefit The Muse.) It brings me immense joy to be able to mount this rehearsal/concert (one service) in partnership with the Virginia Arts Festival and with the great cooperation and assistance from the Virginia Symphony and, OF COURSE, the awesome musicians of this Union.

Did you know that there is a fund to help pay for your live gigs that are free and open to the public? The **Music Performance Trust Fund**, which is a separate entity from the union, has been providing grants for over 70 years.

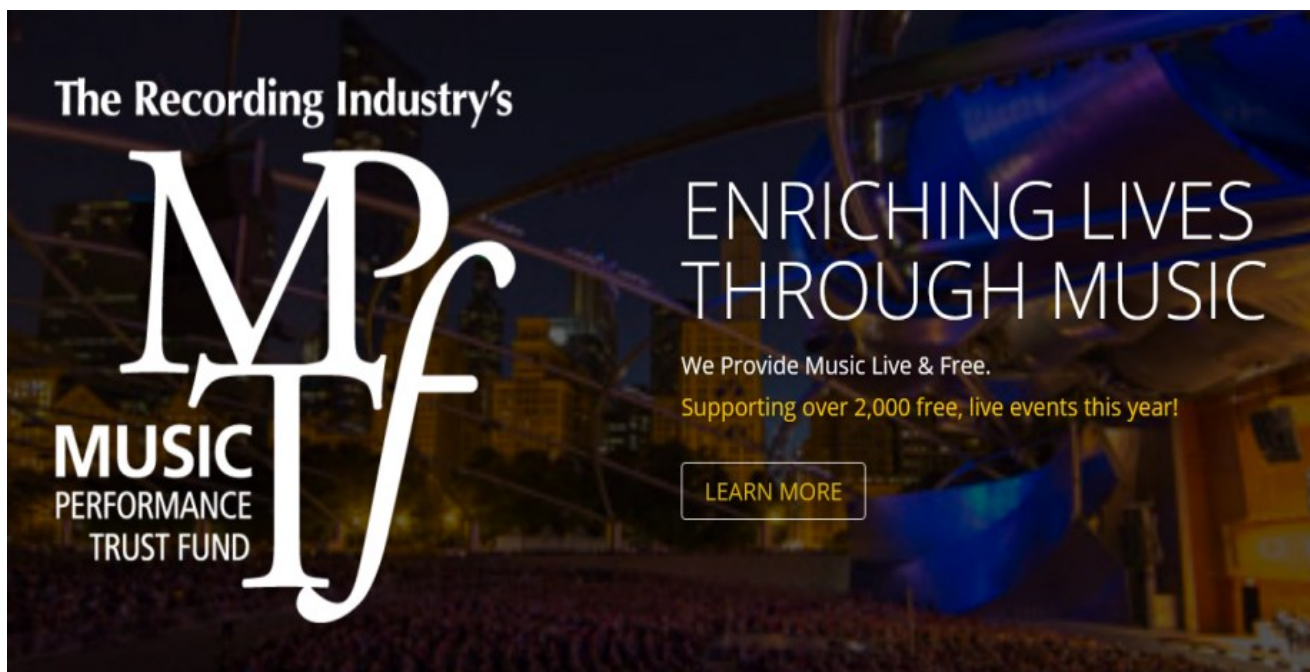
MPTF gigs can take place in parks, schools, and public halls, as well as in hospitals and at nursing homes and retirement centers.

We can't help you find the gig; you must organize and book the gig yourself. You will need to find a "co-sponsor," which means some entity that agrees to share the cost of the gig. Co-sponsors could include a school, nonprofit organization, state or local government, or any kind of business, large or small. If you, as a musician, have an LLC, then YOU can be the co-sponsor.

Finally, you must make sure that you pay your group under an AFM union contract, using the Local 125 Wage Scale Book. Other details apply; we can help with all paperwork and questions. MPTF usually pays for 50% of the cost of the gig, however there are some special programs where 100% of the cost is paid.
